

We launched the first spotlight report on implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by Ukraine with particular focus on LGBT+ component.

The report was presented before the Independent Expert on protection against violence and discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity Victor Madrigal-Borloz during his first monitoring visit to Ukraine.

We engaged 15 representatives of NGOs in the regions of Ukraine to meet with Victor Madrigal-Borloz and talk about the situation with human rights for LGBT+ on the local level.



The report was shared at the Highlevel Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF) in New York, USA.
